JCCP Customized Course Program Completed

Course No. CPJ-5-18 July 24 – Aug. 1, 2018 Course title: Program Formulation Course (PFC) for Indonesia, Myanmar and Vietnam "Natural Gas & LNG" Course Coordinator : Ms. Masumi Kitahara

<Background>

This course aims to discuss and create an action plan for the implementation of future HRD programs and technical cooperation programs themed on natural gas and LNG. Representatives from personnel departments in Indonesia, Myanmar and Vietnam will exchange views about JCCP programs (TR, IT, CPJ and CPO) and technical cooperation with Japanese experts in various fields related to the oil industry, and the needs in each organization will be assessed through interviews, for incorporation into future programs. Additionally, the course will allow JCCP to acquire information about participating organizations and their HRD initiatives, as well as promote the establishment of personal connections and provide opportunities for interviews that would enable JCCP member companies to strengthen their relationships with participating organizations with an eye on future business expansion.

<Content>

This course was implemented as outlined below, by inviting officers and managers from the personnel and LNG & natural gas departments, respectively, at PERTAMINA and MIGAS (Indonesia), MOEE (Myanmar) and MOIT, Petrovietnam and Petrolimex (Vietnam).

- (1) Based on requests that were collected in advance, discussions were held by program and by organization to clarify plans for the future implementation of HRD programs and technical cooperation programs.
 - 1) HRD programs
 - Description and overview of the fiscal 2018/2019 HRD plan
 - Verification of requests for CPO/CPJ in fiscal 2018/2019 and discussions for their implementation
 - Description of the characteristics of JCCP regular courses and their differences with other training institutions
 - 2) Technical cooperation programs
 - Overview and description of technical cooperation programs
 - Description and introduction of fiscal 2018 technical cooperation programs and verification of issues and requests
- (2) Discussions were held with the aim of establishing a relationship of trust between the participants and JCCP staff and strengthening their understanding of Japan and JCCP activities.
- (3) JCCP gained an understanding of the LNG & natural gas situation in each organization and their HRD initiatives through presentations given by the participants.
- (4) Time was allotted for individual interviews, to support the business expansion initiatives of member companies.

<Overview>

Individual interviews were held with Indonesia, Myanmar and Vietnam and their requests were compared against JCCP's proposals. As a result, discussions were able to be held in greater depth toward the implementation of customized programs and technical cooperation programs in the future. Furthermore, holding face-to-face discussions also allowed the participants to establish a relationship of trust with JCCP staff and deepen their knowledge of JCCP's activities.
